### New customer information system goes live February 12

### As we get ready to go live with our new customer information system, please be aware of the following dates:

- Tuesday, February 6, 2018: Final day to make a payment through Bill4U. (No payments accepted after midnight).
- Wednesday, February 7, 2018: February billing statements mailed.
- Thursday and Friday, February 8-9, 2018: Customer information system unavailable to process electric bill payments. Mail or stop by our office to make a payment.
- Monday, February 12, 2018: New and improved customer information system goes live.

### Need Help Signing Up for SmartHub Online Bill Pay?

Jackson Electric's customer service representatives will be available at Jackson Electric Cooperative on the following days to help you sign up for online bill pay:

- Monday, February 19, and Wednesday, February 21, 2018, from 4 to 8 p.m.
- Saturday, February 24, 2018, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

If you can't make it to the office on one of those dates, please feel free to call or stop by during regular office hours.

With this new system, we encourage members to pay their electric bill online. If you do not have access to the internet or do not feel comfortable paying online, the traditional payment options will be available.

### If You Currently Pay Online

None of your log-in information will transfer to the new system. Once you are logged into the new system, you will have to set up your account information. New Jackson Electric account numbers will be assigned, and will be listed on your March billing statement. Please contact our office to receive your account number after February 12 if you would like to set up your online account before the March billing statement is mailed.

If you currently receive paperless electric billing statements, you will have to reset that option in the new system. All accounts will receive a paper billing statement in March.

### **Credit/Debit Card Payments**

To protect your identity, your credit/debit card account number will not transfer to the new online bill pay system. After you set up your account, you will have to re-enter your information.

### **Pay Now Option**

This is a new payment option available with the new system. You will be able to make a one-time online payment by credit card, savings or checking account. Registration will not be required. There will be a link on our website to access the Pay Now page.

This is Jackson Electric's designated phone number for credit and debit card payments. You can continue to call our office with a card payment, but will be redirected to a secure phone line where your payment will be processed.

### **RULES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING**

These rules are set in accordance with Jackson Electric Cooperative Bylaws, Article II, Section 7. Jackson Electric Cooperative's annual meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 13, 2018, at the Lunda Theatre in Black River Falls.

- 1. The meeting will be conducted in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised edition.
- 2. Any speaker must be recognized by the Chair before speaking.
- 3. Only members and duly registered guests will be recognized by the Chair; each person so recognized must give his or her name.
- 4. Unless otherwise approved by the Chair, those recognized are to limit their questions and comments to three minutes, with any rebuttal limited to two minutes.
- Questions and comments from members and duly registered guests will be in order during old and new business sessions, and at the conclusion of the officer reports, if invited.
- 6. No resolution affecting Jackson Electric Cooperative may be submitted by any member, unless written copies have been received by Jackson Electric Cooperative by January 13, 2018. This will permit time for review by the Jackson Electric Cooperative Board of Directors to make its recommendation to the meeting as to approval or rejection.
- 7. No signs or handouts will be permitted within the building of the place of the meeting, except such handouts as required for the official conduct of the Annual Meeting. No handouts made available outside of the building will use the name of the Cooperative, its letterhead or logo to imply that the Cooperative supports or opposes any resolution.
- 8. No demonstrations shall be held within the building of the place of the meeting.

To receive your rebate, contact our office for an application form or go to **www.jackelec.com** to download a form. Please submit to our office your completed and signed rebate application within 60 days following your invoice date with the Energy Star label (if applicable) and paid receipt.

### **Audit-Recommended Improvements**

Incentives are available for energy efficiency improvements completed to an existing home or farm. Energy efficiency improvements must be recommendations from an audit arranged by Jackson Electric Cooperative or a cooperative-approved partner. # PORTABLE ELECTRIC SPACE HEATERS

Uncertainty of winter temperatures is part of living in Wisconsin. Because February has the potential to be a cold month, some of you may be thinking of using a portable electric space heater to warm your home.

Jackson Electric reminds you that even though electric space heaters are 100 percent efficient, they still use a significant amount of electricity. Electric space heaters will increase your electric bill if used regularly. If you must, use an electric space heater for supplemental heat in a small area. They are not designed to heat your entire home.

Remember, a watt is a watt. A 1,500-watt milkhouse heater will generate the same amount of heat as a 1,500-watt infrared heater with a decorative cabinet.


